


## Service




# Loving service is not labor!

When parents serve
their children with a spirit of
resentment and bitterness,
a child's physical needs
may be met, but their
emotional development
will be hampered.



If parents give in to desires or even demands for too many gifts and too much service, our children can remain childishly self-centered and become selfish.





Acts of service must be age appropriate.



As children grow, they notice what is being done for them and are also aware of what has been done in the past.

By the time your child becomes a teenager, you would have been speaking the love language of **Acts of Service** for thirteen years!



You must learn some new dialects if you are to effectively speak the **Acts of Service** love language to your teenager.

Love washes clothes for children when they are too young to do so themselves but that same love teaches them to do laundry when they are old enough to run the machine.

Well meaning parents who continue to do "acts of service" for their children when they are able to do it for themselves may actually cripple their maturity in the name of love.
